

The Yacht Club de Cannes is pleased to invite you to participate in the 35th Régates Royales - Trophée Panerai Edition which will take place under the French Sailing Federation's support from
September 21st until September 28th 2013.

 1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Rules as described in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. The prescriptions of the Fédération Française de voile will apply. See Appendix.
- 1.3. Racing rules and or classes rules changed will appear in full in the sailing instructions.
- 1.4. If there is a conflict between languages, the French text will take precedence.

 2. ADVERTISING

Boats shall be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority, in accordance with ISAF Regulation 20, Advertising Code and its French Sailing federation modifications.

 3. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1. The Régates Royales event is opened to:
 - * 5.5mJl
 - * 6mJl
 - * 8mJl
 - * 12mJl
 - * 15mJl
 - * Requin
 - * Broad One Design Class
- 3.2. Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form or online via www.regatesroyales.com no later than July 12th 2013.
No registration file will be considered as valid unless the entry fee has been paid entirely.
The registration fee includes the Vieux Port de Cannes mooring from 21st until 29th September 2013 at midday.
The registration fee did not include craning for eligible boats nor for Tenders, coach boat etc.
Mooring occupied either side of these dates and after September 29th at midday have to be paid to the Harbor Office in the Vieux Port de Cannes

- 3.3. Over the deadline, the acceptance of late entries will be at the discretion of the organizing committee. The mooring in the harbour can't be guaranteed and the fee will be increased.
- 3.4. Each crew shall supply at the Registration desk:
 - * FFV "Licence" with medical agreement for foreign sailors residing in France, and parental authorization for underage sailors.

- * Non-French competitors unlicensed in France must prove their belonging to a member of an ISAF National Authority.

 5. CRANING

Metric boats requiring a crane operation shall say so at the registration and will be charged additional fees.

 6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1. Registration and craning: September 21st to 23rd, from 9am to 6pm.
- 6.2. Measurement and inspection:, safety equipment's and weight controls may be done randomly by the organization
- 6.3 Skipper briefing: Tuesday, September 24th in the Village. The schedule defined in the Sailing Instructions
- 6.4. Racing days for all classes: September 24th to 28th.
- 6.5. The first warning signal is planned daily at 11.30am for all classes.
- 6.6. Prize giving ceremony will start as soon as possible after the last race on the 28th.

 7. MEASUREMENT

Each boat shall produce a valid measurement certificate and to be in compliance with its class rules.

 8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available after registration confirmation at the registration desk.

 9. VENUE

- 9.1. The mooring will be in the Vieux Port de Cannes.
- 9.2. The races will take place in the bays of Cannes or Golfe Juan.

 10. COURSES

Courses will be windward-leeward or costal course (see Sailing Instructions) located in Cannes eastern or western bays

 11. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 11.1. Rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty
- 11.2. Penalties for breach to a rule other Chapter 2 and RRS 28 and 31, may be after hearing less than DSQ: from a 10% of the number of bats entered to DSQ.
- 11.3. Decisions of the international jury will be final as provided in rule 70.5.
- 11.4. A jury on water process can be implemented according to the Sailing Instructions details.

 12. SCORING

- 12.0. The minimum number of registered entries to have a classification by class is of 3 boats
- 12.1. The scoring system is the low point system of Appendix A.
- 12.2. 12 races are scheduled of which 3 races are required to be completed for the regatta to be valid.
- 12.3 .a) When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will b the total of her race scores.
- b) When 4 races or more have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

 13. SUPPORT BOATS

Any support boat must enter the event by fill in the dedicated entry form as a request upon the Race Committee for an authorization

Tenders, Weather Boats, and Support Vessels will be permitted in the race area under conditions. Organisation could request some fee in relationship with size/LOA.

Details regarding the conduct of these boats will be indicated in the Sailing Instruction.

 14. BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while they are in the harbour.

 15. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

 16. DIVING EQUIPMENTS

Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

 17. RADIO COMMUNICATION

VHF are allowed onboard. VHF Chanel will be given in Sailing instructions

Please note that VHF use is restricted under law. Each skipper must comply with the regulations under his own responsibility.

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. See SI instructions. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

 18. PRIZES

The winner of each class will receive a dedicated Trophy.

 19. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

By entering all competitors taking part in the regatta do so entirely at their own risk – see RRS 4, The decision to race – the organizing authorities do not accept any responsibility in the case of damage to equipment, injuries or death within the framework of the regatta, which includes before, during and after the regatta.

 20. INSURANCE

Each participating boat must have subscribed to a valid third party insurance or equivalent, with a minimum cover of €1.5 million, per incident, for the event.

 21. IMAGE RIGHTS

In participating in the Régates Royales – Panerai Trophy, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing Authority and the Sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of Yacht and crew during the period the competition in which the competitor participates in and all material related to the said Régates Royales – Panerai Trophy without compensation.

Prescriptions of the Fédération Française de Voile Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016

RRS 25 FFVoile Prescription:

For all grade 5 and 4 events, standard notices of race and sailing instructions including the specificities of the event shall be used.

For grade 5 events, posting of sailing instructions will be considered as meeting the requirements of RRS 25 application.

RRS 62 FFVoile Prescription:

For the events of the Fédération Française de Voile, the equipment inspection committee or measurement committee is composed of the event measurer and the equipment inspectors, if any. For purposes of rule 60.2, the event measurer and the equipment inspectors are included in the race committee.

RRS 64.3 FFVoile Prescription (*):

The jury may ask the parties to the protest, prior to checking procedures, a deposit covering the cost of checking arising from a protest concerning class rules.

RRS 67 FFVoile Prescription (*):

Any question about or request of damages arising from an incident involving a boat bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing or International Regulation to Prevent Collision at Sea depends on the appropriate courts and will not be dealt by the jury.

RRS 70. 5 FFVoile Prescription (*):

In such circumstances, the written approval of the Fédération Française de Voile shall be received before publishing the notice of race and shall be posted on the official notice board during the event.

RRS 78 FFVoile Prescription (*):

The boat's owner or other person in charge shall, under his sole responsibility, make sure moreover that his boat comply with the equipment and security rules required by the laws, by-laws and regulations of the Administration.

RCV 86.3 FFVoile Prescription (*):

An organizing authority wishing to change a rule listed in RRS 86.1 in order to develop or test new rules shall first submit the changes to the FFVoile, in order to obtain its written approval and shall report the results to FFVoile after the event. Such authorization shall be mentioned in the notice of race and in the sailing instructions and shall be posted on the official notice board during the event.

RRS 88 FFVoile Prescription (*):

Prescriptions of the FFVoile shall be neither changed nor deleted in the notice of race and sailing instructions, except for events for which an international jury has been appointed.

In such case, the prescriptions marked with an asterisk (*) shall be neither changed nor deleted in the notice of race and sailing instructions. (The official translation of the prescriptions, downloadable on the FFVoile website www.ffvoile.fr, shall be the only translation used to comply with RRS 90.2(b)).

RRS 91 FFVoile Prescription (*):

The appointment of an international jury meeting the requirements of Appendix N is subject to prior written approval of the Fédération Française de Voile. Such notice of approval shall be posted on the official notice board during the event.
