

## Swiss 6mJl Championship 2025 – Season Results & Regatta Highlights

### Geneva, Switzerland — December 2025

The 2025 season of the Swiss 6mJl Championship concluded after an exceptional series of regattas held across the country's most iconic sailing venues. With competitive fleets in both the **Modern** and **Classic** divisions, this year offered tight battles, stunning comebacks, and remarkable consistency from the leading teams.

Across events from **La Tour-de-Peilz**, **Lutry**, **Geneva**, **Rolle**, **Kreuzlingen**, **Versoix**, **Yvoire**, and **Port de Corsier**, crews demonstrated exemplary skill and sportsmanship, confirming the 6mJl class as one of Switzerland's most vibrant traditions in classic sailing.

### Overall Results – Modern Division

After a season of strong performances and regular podium finishes, **LILLYBELLE (SUI 141)** claimed the **2025 Swiss 6mJl Modern Championship** with a total of **37 points**.

Close behind, **IRENE (SUI 91)** and **SAINT FRANCIS IX (SUI 135)** completed the championship podium with **40** and **42 points**, respectively.

#### Top 3 — Modern Division:

1. **LILLYBELLE (SUI 141)** – 37 pts
2. **IRENE (SUI 91)** – 40 pts
3. **SAINT FRANCIS IX (SUI 135)** – 42 pts

Other notable contenders included **JUNIOR (SUI 77)**, **THISBE (SUI 111)**, and **MOBYDICK (SUI 73)**, all of which delivered solid performances throughout the season.

### Overall Results – Classic Division

In the Classic fleet, **SASKIA II (SUI 19)** dominated the season with consistent sailing and a strong presence across all events, earning **61 points** and the title of **2025 Swiss 6mJl Classic Champion**.

They were followed by **AERA (GRE 2)** with **78 points** and **VEGA (Z 2)** with **82 points**, after a competitive fight throughout the circuit.

#### Top 3 — Classic Division:

1. **SASKIA II (SUI 19)** – 61 pts
2. **AERA (GRE 2)** – 78 pts
3. **VEGA (Z 2)** – 82 pts

The Classic fleet demonstrated remarkable depth with close results among **GLANA**, **FUN**, **ASTREE III**, **YLLIAM IV**, and **ELISABETH X**, making this one of the most exciting Classic seasons to date.

### Regatta-by-Regatta Highlights

**La Tour-de-Peilz** – Trophée du Maharadjah: the season opened in La Tour-de-Peilz with the prestigious Maharaja Trophy, marking a great start to the year. The event stood out thanks to remarkable international attendance, reinforcing the growing visibility of the Swiss 6mJl circuit.

**Rolle** rewarded consistency, with several boats climbing up the leaderboard.

**Kreuzlingen** delivered decisive performances, especially among the contenders fighting for mid-season momentum.

**Yvoire** and **Port de Corsier** closed the championship under challenging conditions, pushing teams to navigate with precision and adaptability.

### A Season to Remember

The 2025 season once again highlighted the strength, elegance, and competitive spirit of the 6mJl class in Switzerland. The Swiss 6mJl Association extends warm congratulations to all participating crews, race committees, and partner clubs who made this year's championship a success.
